In 2011, INEBRIA will hold its annual conference in the United States for the first time.

- The 8th annual INEBRIA conference will foster the development and dissemination of research relevant to alcohol screening and brief intervention (SBI).
- The conference will communicate new findings about research questions that remain unanswered regarding alcohol SBI and increase collaboration among alcohol SBI researchers worldwide.
- Junior researchers will be engaged in SBI research opportunities with an outlet for their work and with mentoring opportunities.
- A 1-day *Implementing and Sustaining Alcohol and Other Drug Screening and Brief Intervention (AOD-SBI) Meeting: Lessons from Large Scale Efforts* will be held on September 21st. The purpose of this meeting is to bring researchers and practitioners together to address both drug and alcohol SBI.



INEBRIA's overall aim is to promote the implementation of brief interventions in a variety of settings for hazardous and harmful alcohol consumption at local, national and international levels.
